#### PEDESTRIAN SAFETY

Plant traffic is a very real danger which is often taken way too lightly. And yet, near misses and even serious accidents are not uncommon in the workplace. So, who's most vulnerable? Pedestrians.

Forklifts, transport vehicles, autos – work zones are often buzzing with traffic, goods are on the move, spare parts being fetched from the warehouse, trucks loaded, vehicles parking – a hive of activity. And whenever traffic is on the move, hazardous situations and accidents are unfortunately never far away.

Watch out for pedestrians! Accidents involving forklifts or transport vehicles are all too commonplace, although fast moving vehicles can pose a real threat on factory premises as well. It's worth remembering that it's not always the drivers who put others at risk. In many cases, it's the pedestrians who put themselves in danger or even provoke an accident by disregarding safety.
