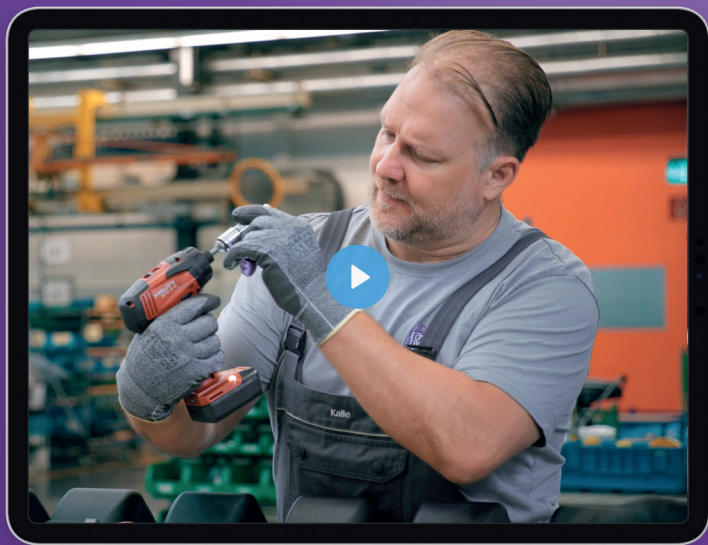


EPISODE 9: NOTHING TO REPORT
